

Objectives of AHIES

• The primary objective of AHIES is to improve the measurement of GDP.

- The secondary objectives are to:
 - 1. Measure monetary and non-monetary poverty;
 - 2. Compute food insecurity;
 - 3. Estimate labour statistics;
 - 4. Assess labour mobilities; and
 - 5. Identify households and individuals burdened with multiple socioeconomic challenges (triple burdened households and individuals)

Key Concepts (1/2)

- Labour force: all persons 15 years and older who were either employed or unemployed seven days preceding the interview date.
- Vulnerable employment: employment as own-account (self-employed without employees) or contributing family workers.
- **Unemployed persons**: persons 15 years and older, who in the seven days preceding the interview date did not work and did not have work to go back to; and were available to work.
- Unemployment spell: an uninterrupted time period within which a person has stayed unemployed. In the context of this report, it is the state of being unemployed across the three quarters.

Key Concepts (2/2)

- Labor mobility: movement of labour from either one geographical area to the other or from one sector, status, or occupation of employment to the other.
- Balanced panel data: contains complete information on all individuals or entities who continuously remained in the survey across all the specified time periods
- **Unbalanced panel data**: contains incomplete information on some individuals or entities because they did not participate in all time periods of the survey


Methodology

- 1. Quarterly household panel survey
- 2. National, regional and urban-rural representative sample
- 3. Weights obtained from 2021 Population and Housing Census
- 4. Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI)
- 5. Units of analysis: Persons 15 years and older
- 6. Reference period: Seven (7) days preceding the interview



Economic Activity Status






Vulnerable Employment






Unemployment Rate






Employment Status in Q1 of Unemployed Persons in Q3






Youth Population (15-35 Years) Not In Employment, Education Or Training (NEET)



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




Mobilities from Formal and Informal Employment to Unemployment






Mobilities across Economic Sectors of Employment






Sectoral Shares of Employed Persons in Q1 who were Unemployed in Q2 and Q3




Labour Mobilities across Employment Status of Employed Persons in Q1







Labour Mobilities across Employment Status of Unemployed Persons in Q1



Labour Mobilities across Employment Status of Persons Outside the Labour Force in Q1




Reasons for Being Outside the Labour Force






Multiple Burdens (Unemployment, Food Insecurity and Multidimensional Poverty)

Key Messages

- 1. About 1.76 million persons were unemployed.
 - a. Two out of every three were female.
 - b. Across the three quarters, about 157,000 persons experienced an unemployment spell.
- Across the three quarters about 3.5 million persons were moving in and out of employment depicting vulnerabilities.
- 3. Two out of every three employed persons in Q1 who were unemployed in Q3, were in vulnerable employment.
- 4. Transition from informal employment to unemployment is on the average five times than from formal employment into unemployment.
- 5. The population that is triple burdened decreased by 78,000 between Q1 and Q2, but increased by almost 55,000 in Q3.
